FOOD SCRAPS

Take produce stickers off first!

- ✓ Backyard bin
- ✓ Drop-off / pickup

MEAT, BONES & DAIRY

These take longer to break down. In a backyard bin, they can attract animals.

- ✓ Drop-off / pickup only

UNCOATED PAPER

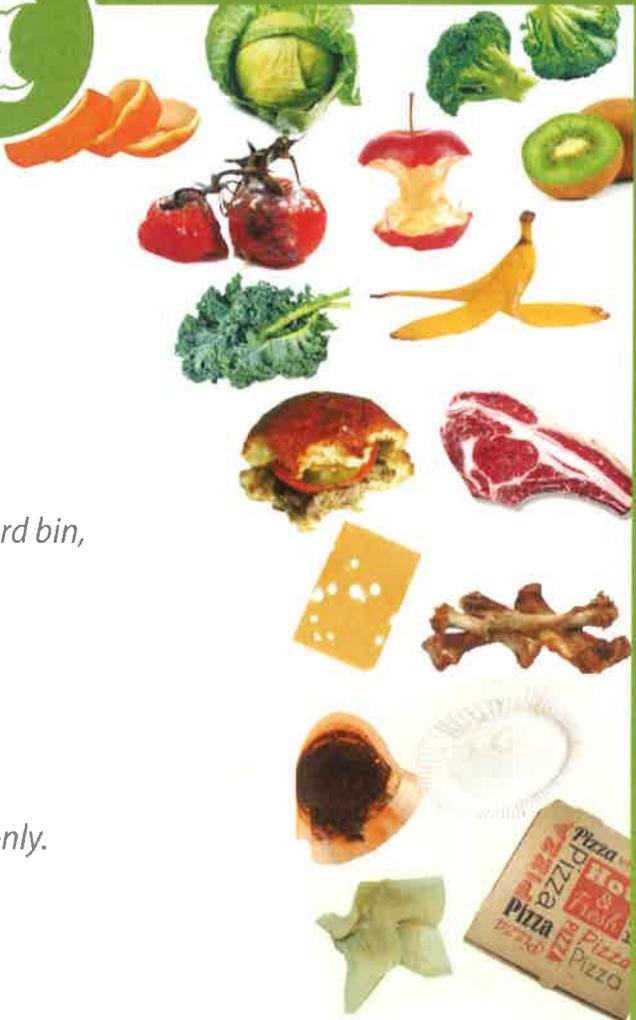
Plain, uncoated paper and cardboard items only.

- ✓ Backyard bin
- ✓ Drop-off / pickup

COMPOSTABLE PRODUCTS

Bags, cups, etc. must be 100% certified compostable. They break down best in large, commercial composting facilities.

- ✓ Drop-off / pickup is best

HOW TO GET STARTED

- 1. Get a collection container** for your kitchen (like an empty yogurt tub or a small pail). If you'll be dropping off food scraps, a 5-gallon bucket with a tight-fitting lid works well for transport.
- 2. Line your kitchen pail** with a paper towel, newspaper, leaves or a certified compostable bag to keep it cleaner. Layering food scraps with paper towels or coffee grounds helps control odors. Some pails have a built-in charcoal filter to help contain odor.
- 3. Start collecting food scraps!**
(See reverse for what goes in.)
- 4. Empty it** directly into your backyard bin, or into your drop-off bucket or pickup cart.
- 5. Rinse and repeat!**

BACKYARD

Use 3 times as many "browns" as food scraps (browns include leaves, shredded newspaper, wood shavings, or straw). For more tips, troubleshooting, and workshop dates, visit our website.
